Maurice and friends—Chita Rivera, Mercedes Ellington, and Debbie Allen—tell tales from his lengthy career, including Broadway shows, a co-starring role in Francis Ford Coppola's *THE COTTON CLUB*, and his loving yet complex relationship with his superstar brother, the late Gregory Hines. Ever battling the challenges of being a gay, black man in show business, Maurice shares his story with humor and grace.

Recorded over the course of three years, the film magically intercuts rare archival footage with present-day moments, interviews, and candid conversations with Maurice from ages 73 to 75. Producers, John Carluccio and Tracy E. Hopkins, are proud to have given this living legend his flowers and his turn in the spotlight while he was still alive. On December 29, 2023, Maurice passed away; he was 80 years old.

Maurice was a Tony-nominated singer, dancer, and actor. Hailed as "a high-energy hoofer with strong views," the native New Yorker had a remarkable seven-decade career in show business. Beginning at age five, Maurice started tapping and performing with his younger brother, Gregory Hines. In the 1960s, the brothers performed with their father in the music trio, Hines, Hines & Dad. Maurice started in the musicals *Eubie!, Sophisticated Ladies*, and *Jelly's Last Jam*. He conceived, directed, and choreographed the Broadway musicals *Uptown...It's Hot!* (1986 Tony nomination) and *Hot Feet* (2006). More about Maurice (LA Times obit).
